FEES

Tuition:

Tuition for Kindergarten is \$1,750.00 per year for one child

Tuition is \$3,500.00 per year for one child

Tuition is \$3,250.00 per year for each of two children (i.e. \$6,500.00 per year for two children total)

Tuition is payable in ten equal monthly installments by post dated cheques due the first of each month beginning September 1, 2025 and ending June 1, 2026. For one child this amounts to \$350/month for 10 months. For two children this amounts to \$650/month total for two children.

Registration:

The registration fee is \$50.00 and is deductible from tuition. Registration fee will be returned if the school does not proceed.

Note:

In the unlikely event the school does not proceed, all funds will be returned.

Other Fees:

Field trips and other costs, such as school T-shirts, may arise during the year and are additional to the amount above.

Code of Conduct Outline

The MBCES Code of Conduct document provides details about the behavior that is expected from students and the consequences that could result if those expectations are not met. The statements below are a summary of the Code of Conduct document.

Students at MBCES have the following rights:

- to be safe
- to be accepted and treated with dignity and respect
- to learn without interference.

A. Students at MBCES have the following responsibilities:

- to demonstrate Christ-like character
- to respect all teachers, students and others
- to express themselves with biblically and socially acceptable language and behavior
- to exhibit behavior that avoids all forms of intimidation, harassment, racism, and discrimination
- to dress in accordance with school dress standards
- to treat school property and the property of others with a reasonable standard of care
- to respect the responsibilities of all school members in exercising their duties
- to promote positive behavior through the avoidance of all types of violent acts
- to attend classes, activities and events and be prepared and punctual
- to show courtesy and respect for all people in the school and in the community
- to demonstrate behavior that contributes to an orderly, supportive and safe learning environment
- to resolve interpersonal conflicts and difficulties through discussions or by seeking assistance from school personnel to develop self-discipline.

B. Attendance Outline

Students have a responsibility to attend the classes for which they are scheduled and to study and learn well. There is a direct relationship between regular, punctual attendance, effort and success in school. Parents should attempt to make medical, dental, and other appointments outside of school hours whenever possible. A note, email, or phone call will be required from a student's parent/guardian if the student needs to be excused from school for part of the day. If a student is ill, or is not present at school for other reasons, the parent/guardian is to call the school office and notify the school. Students are responsible to make up the schoolwork from any classes that are missed.

C. Parental Involvement Outline

Parental involvement is critical to a child's success. We encourage all parents to take an active role in their child's education at home.

D. Electronic Devices

Students are not permitted to be on cell phones or other electronic devices during school. (Emergency numbers will be provided)

E. Standards of Dress

This Policy has been implemented to assist primarily with modesty and enforcement issues.

- 1. Girls and boys hair styles should be neat and well kept. No unnatural hair coloring (e.g. green, blue etc) is permitted
- 2. Female students who choose to wear a skirt or dress must wear shorts or tights underneath.
- 3. Clean shoes must be worn in the building at all times. Students should have an extra pair on hand.
- 4. No pictures, slogans etc. on clothing that demeans others or contravenes the MB Confession of Faith.
- 5. No spaghetti straps
- 6. No low necklines
